March 2010: This two-story, two-bay, Queen Anne-style rowhouse was constructed by Pumphrey and Palmer from the design of Edward O. Volland in 1908. It is one of four rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#0054). The dwelling is constructed of brick and is set on a solid concrete foundation; the façade (north elevation) is faced with stretcherbond pressed brick. A sloping roof caps the dwelling and is highlighted by a molded metal cornice, a plain brick frieze, and a molded metal architrave. A single-leaf paneled wood door with stained glass light is located in the westernmost bay of the first story on the façade. This opening is highlighted by a rectangular one-light transom and a rock-faced concrete-lug lintel. Metal steps with metal hand rails provide access to the main entrance. A three-sided, canted bay with rounded edges projects from the easternmost bay of the façade and rises the full height of the dwelling. The bay shares the material treatment of the main block. All openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with rock-faced concrete sills and lintels.

A two-story, two-bay ell is located on the eastern end of the rear (south) elevation and is original. The rear elevation has been faced with horizontal siding and is fenestrated with a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window. An exterior-side chimney is located on the west elevation of the ell and has a plain cap. An original porch has been enclosed on the first story and is capped by a shed roof. The wood-frame appendage is faced with horizontal vinyl siding and holds a singleleaf wood door with lights in the eastern end bay. The opening is highlighted by a single-light rectangular transom. The elevation is further fenestrated by 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows.





March 2010: This two-story, three-bay Queen Anne-style rowhouse was constructed by Ray E. Middaugh from the design of R.J. Beall, Jr. in 1895. The foundation is further pierced by 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with soldier brick segmental arches capped by brick molding. The northernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf wood-frame glass door with a one-light transom highlighted by a rusticated concrete-lug lintel. This door leads to an interior vestibule with a single-leaf paneled wood door. The door is accessed via metal steps with gas pipe railings. The first story is further fenestrated by 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash widows with concrete-lug sills and rusticated concrete-lug lintels. The second story holds a bowed metal oriel window with a gadrooned support. The oriel is capped by a pyramidal roof of slate shingles and shares the cornice of the main block. The oriel is fenestrated with three 1/1, double-hung, wood-sash windows with arabesque ornamentation below.

A two-story, two-bay ell constructed of brick is located on the northern end of the rear (west) elevation and is original. The ell is capped by a sloping roof and an exterior brick chimney with a parged cap is located at the southwest corner. The west elevation has been parged and painted with a mural on the first story. Openings in the northernmost bay on the first and second stories hold single-leaf wood-frame doors highlighted by single-light transoms. The southernmost bays on both stories hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills. A one-story wood porch spans the elevation on the second story and is supported by square wood posts. Square wood balusters encircle the porch.

The door is accessed via metal steps with gas pipe railings. The first story is further fenestrated by 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash widows with concrete-lug sills and rusticated concrete-lug lintels. The second story holds a bowed metal oriel window with a gadrooned support. The oriel is capped by a pyramidal roof of slate shingles and shares the cornice of the main block. The oriel is fenestrated with three 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with arabesque ornamentation below.

A two-story, two-bay ell constructed of brick is located on the northern end of the rear (west) elevation and is original. A single-leaf wood-frame glass door is located in the northernmost bay and a 1/1, double-hung, sash window (materials not visible) is located in the southernmost bay on the first story. 

Queen Anne

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-and-one-half-story, two-bay, Queen Anne-style single dwelling was designed and constructed in 1904 by F.J. Ettinger. It is one of two dwellings constructed from the same permit (#1066). The dwelling is constructed of brick and is set on a solid concrete foundation; the façade (north elevation) is faced with stretcher-bond pressed brick. A sloping roof caps the dwelling and is highlighted by a molded metal cornice with brick dentil molding. An interior-side brick chimney rises from the west (side) elevation of the dwelling and has a corbeled cap. Recessed brick spandrel panels are located above the second story window openings. A single-leaf paneled door with lights is located in the easternmost bay of the first story on the façade. This opening is highlighted by a rectangular one-light transom and a rock-faced concrete-lug lintel. Concrete steps with brick and concrete wing walls provide access to a concrete stoop with solid brick and concrete balusters at the main entrance. A three-sided, canted bay projects from the westernmost bay of the façade and rises the full height of the dwelling. The bay shares the material treatment of the main block but additionally has two-course sill courses below the first and second story window openings. A rectangular single-light wood window with concrete sill is located below a plain metal frieze that complements the cornice on the bay. The bay is also capped by a pyramidal roof of slate shingles and a metal finial. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills and rock-faced concrete-lug lintels.

The west (side) elevation received the same treatment as the projecting bay on the façade. A two-story, two-bay, threesided canted bay projects from the center of the west elevation. This bay has brick dentil molding below the molded cornice. All openings on the elevation hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills and rock-faced concrete-lug lintels.

The rear (south) elevation was not fully visible due to fencing, but it is fenestrated with 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete-lug sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches on the second story.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This end-unit dwelling is located on the south side of G Street, N.E., southeast of the intersection of G and 5th Streets, N.E. It is set back approximately fifteen feet from the brick sidewalk. The east (side) elevation is adjacent to 503 G Street, N.E. The front and side yard are landscaped and planted with mature shrubs and foundation plantings; they are bordered by a milled point metal fence. A concrete and brick walkway leads from the sidewalk and travels toward the primary entrance. The rear yard holds a patio of concrete pavers and is enclosed by a wood privacy fence.

Queen Anne

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-and-one-half-story, two-bay, Queen Anne-style single dwelling was designed and constructed in 1904 by F.J. Ettinger. It is one of two dwellings constructed from the same permit (#1066). The dwelling is constructed of brick and is set on a solid concrete foundation; the façade (north elevation) is faced with stretcher-bond pressed brick. A sloping roof caps the dwelling and is highlighted by a molded metal cornice with brick dentil molding. Recessed brick spandrel panels are located above the second story window openings. A single-leaf paneled wood door is located in the easternmost bay of the first story on the façade. This opening is highlighted by a rectangular one-light transom and a rock-faced concrete-lug lintel. Concrete steps with concrete wing walls provide access to a concrete stoop with solid brick and concrete balusters at the main entrance. A three-sided, canted bay projects from the westernmost bay of the façade and rises the full height of the dwelling. The bay shares the material treatment of the main block but additionally has two-course sill courses below the first and second story window openings. A rectangular single-light wood window with concrete sill is located below a plain metal frieze that complements the cornice on the bay. The bay is also capped by a pyramidal roof of slate shingles and a metal finial. A one-light blind windows pierces the foundation and has a rock-faced concrete-lug lintel. The first story on the bay holds a one-light metal window with a rock-faced concrete-lug lintel. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, metal-sash windows with concrete sills and rock-faced concrete-lug lintels.

A two-story, two-bay ell is located on the eastern end of the rear (south) elevation and is original. The rear has been parged. An exterior-side chimney is located on the west elevation of the ell and has a parged cap. A recessed single-leaf wood-frame glass door is located in the eastern end bay of the first story of the ell. The rear is further fenestrated by 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This single dwelling is located on the south side of G Street, N.E. and is set back approximately fifteen feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 501 and 505 G Street, N.E. The front yard is planted with mature shrubs and is bordered by a milled point metal fence. A brick walkway leads from the sidewalk and travels toward the primary entrance. The rear yard holds a concrete paved patio and is enclosed by a wood chain link metal fence.

Queen Anne

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-story, two-bay Queen Anne-style rowhouse was constructed in 1909 by M.L. Gottwals from the design of Edward O. Volland from permit #1351. The six-course American-bond brick structure sits on a solid concrete foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is complemented by a false mansard of slate fish scale shingles set between two brick firewalls on the façade (west elevation). The mansard features a molded metal cornice with modillions and dentils. The façade is faced with stretcher-bond brick. The foundation is pierced in the northernmost bay by a single-leaf paneled metal door with lights. The northernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with one-light transom and a concrete-lug lintel. The entry is accessed via metal steps with metal hand rails. A three-sided canted bay rises the full height of the dwelling and projects from the southern end bay. The bay shares the material treatment of the main block and is capped by a pyramidal roof of slate fish scale shingles. The foundation is pierced with 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with with concrete sills and concrete-lug lintels or splayed brick lintels with keystones.

The north (side) elevation is fenestrated with two-light vinyl sliding windows on the foundation and 2/2, double-hung, wood-sash windows on the other stories. All openings are highlighted by concrete sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches.

The rear (east) elevation holds single-leaf wood French doors in the northernmost bay on the basement, first, and second stories. The doors on the first and second stories feature one-light transoms and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches. The foundation is further pierced by two-light vinyl sliding windows with rowlock brick sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches. Openings on the first story hold a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window and a two-light vinyl sliding window above a one-light opening. Both windows have concrete sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches. The second story holds a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window and a two-light vinyl sliding window above a one-light opening. Both windows have concrete sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches. The second story holds a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window with a concrete sill and a two-course rowlock brick segmental arche. A one-story metal porch projects from the first story of the elevation. It is supported by round metal posts and is encircled by metal balusters. The porch is accessed via metal steps in the northern end bay.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This end-unit rowhouse is located on the east side of 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the concrete sidewalk. The south (side) elevation is adjacent to 645 5th Street, N.E. and the north (side) elevation is adjacent to a brick alley. The flat front yard contains mature shrubs and trees and is bounded by a brick retaining wall and metal picket fencing. A brick walkway leads from the sidewalk and travels toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard bordered by wood privacy fencing is located at the rear of the dwelling.

The façade is faced with stretcher-bond brick. The foundation is pierced by a vinyl sliding window and a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window with concrete-lug lintels. The northernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with lights and a one-light wood transom with a concrete-lug lintel. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, wood-sash windows with concrete sills. Openings on the first story have concrete-lug lintels while openings on the second story have splayed brick lintels with concrete keystones. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a brick pier foundation. The porch has a sloped roof with overhanging eaves and a molded cornice and is supported by square brick posts. Metal balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the northern end bay.

A two-story, two-bay brick ell is located on the south bay of the rear (east) elevation and is original. An exterior brick chimney with a corbeled cap is located in the northeast corner of the ell, which is capped by a sloped roof. A two-story porch with a shed roof has been enclosed by vinyl siding. The first story holds a single-leaf door with lights in the southern end bay and 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows and one-light fixed vinyl windows in other openings. The second story holds sliding vinyl windows.

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the east side of 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the concrete sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 637 and 641 5th Street, N.E. The flat, raised front yard contains mature shrubs and foundation plantings and is bounded by a stone retaining wall. Concrete steps lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary entrance. 

The northernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with a semicircular light and a one-light wood transom with a concrete-lug lintel. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills. Openings on the first story have concrete-lug lintels while openings on the second story have splayed brick lintels with concrete keystones. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a brick pier foundation infilled with brick. The foundation is pierced with one-light vinyl awning windows. The porch has a sloped roof with overhanging eaves and a molded cornice and is supported by square brick posts. Metal balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the northern end bay.

A two-story, two-bay brick ell is located on the north bay of the rear (east) elevation and is original. A brick chimney with a corbeled cap is located in the southeast corner of the ell, which is capped by a sloped roof. A two-story porch with a shed roof is located on the east elevation of the ell. The porch is supported by wood posts and encircled by square wood balusters. The rear was obscured by garages, but a single-leaf wood-frame glass door with a one-light transom and a 1/1, double-hung, sash window are located on the second story.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the east side of 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the concrete sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 639 and 643 5th Street, N.E. The flat, raised front yard contains mature shrubs and foundation plantings and is bounded by a stone retaining wall. Concrete steps lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary entrance. A yard bordered by wood privacy fencing and a garage are located at the rear of the dwelling.

Classical Revival

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-and-a-half-story, three-bay Classical Revival-style rowhouse was constructed in 1909 by M.L. Gottwals from the design of Edward O. Volland. It is one of four similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#1352). The brick structure sits on a solid concrete foundation and is capped by a sloping roof that is fronted by a false mansard of slate fish scale shingles between two brick firewalls on the façade (west elevation). All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills. Openings on the first story have splayed brick lintels with concrete keystones. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a brick pier foundation infilled with brick. The foundation is pierced with a six-light wood window on the façade. The porch has a sloped roof with overhanging eaves and a molded cornice and is supported by square brick posts. Metal balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the northern end bay.

The rear (east) elevation was partially obscured by rear fencing, but a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window with a twocourse rowlock brick segmental arch is located on the second story. A two-story, two-bay brick ell is located on the south bay of the elevation and is original. A brick chimney with a corbeled cap is located in the northeast corner of the ell, which is capped by a sloped roof. A two-story porch with a shed roof is located on the east elevation of the ell. The porch is supported by wood posts and encircled by square wood balusters. A single-leaf door with a one-light transom and a 1/1, double-hung, sash window are located on the second story of the ell.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the east side of 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the concrete sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 641 and 645 5th Street, N.E. The flat, raised front yard contains mature shrubs and foundation plantings and is bounded by a stone retaining wall. Concrete steps lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary entrance. A yard bordered by wood privacy fencing is located at the rear of the dwelling.

Openings on the first story have concrete-lug lintels while openings on the second story have splayed brick lintels with concrete keystones. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a brick pier foundation infilled with brick. The foundation is pierced with a one-light awning window on the façade. The porch has a sloped roof with overhanging eaves and a molded cornice and is supported by square brick posts. Metal balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via brick steps in the northern end bay.

The rear (east) elevation is fenestrated on the second story by a 3/3, double-hung, wood-sash window with a concrete sill and a two-course rowlock brick segmental arch. A two-story, two-bay brick ell is located on the north bay of the elevation and is original. An exterior brick chimney with a corbeled cap is located in the southeast corner of the ell, which is capped by a sloped roof. A two-story porch with a shed roof has been enclosed by vinyl siding. The first story holds a single-leaf door in the northern end bay and paired 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows in the southern bay. The second story holds triple 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows.

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the east side of 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the concrete sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 643 and 647 5th Street, N.E. The flat, raised front yard contains mature shrubs and foundation plantings and is bounded by a brick retaining wall and metal fencing. Brick steps lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary entrance. A yard bordered by wood privacy fencing is located at the rear of the dwelling.

Queen Anne Italianate

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This three-story, two-bay Queen Anne-style rowhouse, influenced by the Italianate style, was constructed by Edward Woltz in 1889. It is one of seven rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#1423). The seven-course American-bond brick dwelling is set on a solid brick foundation and is capped by a sloping roof. The roof is complemented by a molded metal cornice and a corbeled brick table. The facade (south elevation) features a threecourse brick water table and two-course brick sill courses that run below all window openings. The easternmost bay on the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with a single-light transom. The opening is highlighted by a soldier brick segmental arch capped by header brick molding. A three-story, three-sided rectangular bay projects from the western bay of the façade and received the same material treatment as the main block. All openings on the façade hold single or paired 2/2, double-hung, wood-sash windows with wood sills and soldier brick segmental arches capped by header brick molding.

The west (side) elevation is pierced by a single-leaf paneled wood door with lights in a central bay of the first story. The second story holds a single-leaf wood French door in the southernmost bay. The elevation is further fenestrated by 2/2, double-hung, wood-sash windows with wood sills and soldier brick segmental arches capped by header brick molding. An interior brick chimney with a corbeled cap is located on the elevation. A two-story, three-bay wood porch projects from the first and second stories of the elevation. The porch is set on a solid brick foundation and is capped by a sloped roof supported by square wood posts. Square wood balusters encircle the porch. A three-story, three-sided rectangular bay projects from the northernmost bay of the elevation and received the same material treatment as the main block. The first story on the south elevation of the bay holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with lights and a one-light transom leading onto the porch. The second story holds a single-leaf wood French door leading onto the porch. All other openings on the bay hold single or paired 2/2, double-hung, wood-sash windows with wood sills and soldier brick segmental arches capped by header brick molding.

The rear (north) elevation is fenestrated by a 2/2, double-hung, wood-sash window with a header brick sill and a rowlock brick segmental arch. A one-and-a-half-story, two-bay addition constructed ca. 1920 is located on the rear elevation. This seven-course American-bond brick structure is capped by a shed roof. Brick dentil molding complements the roof on the west elevation of the addition. A single-leaf paneled wood door with a two-course rowlock brick segmental arch is located in the westernmost bay of the north elevation on the first story. All other openings on the addition hold 2/2, double-hung, wood-sash windows with wood sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This end-unit rowhouse is located on a corner lot on the north side of F Street, N.E. at the intersection of F Street and 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately five feet from the brick sidewalk. The east (side) elevation is adjacent to 502 F Street, N.E. The grassy, sloping yard borders the front, side, and rear elevations and is planted with mature shrubs and foundation plantings. A brick walkway leads from the sidewalk to the main entrance. The yard is enclosed by metal and wood picket fencing.

March 2010: This three-story, two-bay Queen Anne-style rowhouse, influenced by the Italianate style, was constructed by Edward Woltz in 1889. It is one of seven rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#1423). The seven-course American-bond brick dwelling is set on a solid brick foundation and is capped by a sloping roof. The roof is complemented by a molded metal cornice and a corbeled brick table. The façade (south elevation) features a three-course brick water table and two-course brick sill courses that run below all window openings. The easternmost bay on the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with a one-light transom accessed by a concrete stoop. The opening is highlighted by a soldier brick segmental arch capped by header brick molding. A three-story, three-sided rectangular bay projects from the western bay of the façade and received the same material treatment as the main block. All openings on the façade hold single or paired 1/1, double-hung, wood-sash windows. The openings feature header brick sills and soldier brick segmental arches capped by header brick molding.

The rear (north) elevation was has been parged and was partially obscured by rear fencing. A two-story concrete-block addition that has been parged on the west elevation is located on the rear and was constructed ca. 1990. The first story is fenestrated by a door opening capped by a single-light transom. The second story holds a 6/6, double-hung, wood-sash window flanked by smaller 6/6, double-hung, wood-sash windows with fixed wood windows above. A deck is located atop the addition and is encircled by square wood balusters. A single-leaf wood-frame glass door with side lights and a single-light transom provides access from the third story onto this deck.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the north side of F Street, N.E. and is set back approximately five feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 508 and 512 F Street, N.E. A small front yard planted with mature shrubs is bordered by a metal bow and picket fence and a concrete walkway leads from the sidewalk to the main entrance. A yard enclosed by wood fencing is located at the rear of the dwelling.

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This three-story, two-bay Queen Anne-style rowhouse, influenced by the Italianate style, was constructed by Edward Woltz in 1889. It is one of seven rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#1423). The seven-course American-bond brick dwelling is set on a solid brick foundation and is capped by a sloping roof. The roof is complemented by a molded metal cornice with dentils and a corbeled brick table. The façade (south elevation) features a three-course brick water table and two-course brick sill courses that run below all window openings. The easternmost bay on the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with a three-light transom. The opening is highlighted by a soldier brick segmental arch capped by header brick molding. A three-story, three-sided rectangular bay projects from the western bay of the façade and received the same material treatment as the main block. Openings on the southern elevation of the bay hold 28-light fixed wood windows with concrete sills and soldier brick segmental arches capped by header brick molding. All other openings on the façade hold 6/6, double-hung, wood-sash windows with concrete sills and soldier brick segmental arches capped by header brick molding.

The rear (north) elevation has been parged and is fenestrated by a single-leaf door with a blind transom in the eastern end bay. The western bay holds a multi-light wood window. A one-story, one-bay shed is attached to the elevation in the westernmost bay. This structure is faced with vertical siding and has a sloped roof. All other openings hold 6/6, doublehung, wood-sash windows with concrete or rowlock brick sills.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the north side of F Street, N.E. and is set back approximately five feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 510 and 514 F Street, N.E. A small front yard planted with mature shrubs and foundation plantings is bordered by a metal picket fence and a brick walkway leads from the sidewalk to the main entrance. A yard enclosed by wood fencing is located at the rear of the dwelling.

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-story, two-bay Queen Anne-style rowhouse was constructed by Pumphrey and Palmer in 1909. It is one of three similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#3494). The six-course American-bond brick structure sits on a solid concrete foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is complemented by a molded metal cornice with scroll modillions and a frieze with swag molding on the façade (west elevation). The façade is faced with stretcher-bond brick. The foundation is pierced by a single-leaf, wood-frame glass door in the southern end bay. The southernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf wood-frame glass door with a one-light wood transom and a rusticated concrete-lug lintel. The entry is accessed via metal steps with metal hand rails. A three-sided canted bay rises the full height of the dwelling and projects from the northern end bay. The bay shares the material treatment of the main block. All openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with rusticated concrete-lug sills and lintels. The south (side) elevation has several window openings that have been infilled with brick. The foundation is pierced by two single-light openings with two-course rowlock brick segmental arches.

The rear (east) elevation has an exterior-end brick chimney with a parged cap in the central bay. The southern bay holds a single-leaf door with a one-light transom. The northern end bay holds paired 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with a rowlock brick sill. The second story is fenestrated by single-leaf wood-frame glass doors with metal balusters and rowlock brick sills.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This end-unit rowhouse is located on the east side of 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the concrete sidewalk. The north (side) elevation is adjacent to 613 5th Street, N.E. and the south (side) elevation is adjacent to a brick alley. The flat, raised front yard contains immature shrubs and trees. The yard is bounded by a stone retaining wall and a metal fence. Concrete steps and a concrete walkway lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard bordered by a concrete-block wall and a garage are located at the rear of the dwelling.

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This four-story, four-bay Classical Revival-style rowhouse was constructed by I.B. Bursey in 1904 from permit #2012. The six-course American-bond brick structure sits on a solid concrete foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is complemented by a molded and boxed metal cornice with scroll modillions, dentils, and swag molding on the façade (west elevation). The façade is faced with Flemish-bond pressed brick. The northernmost bay on the first story is pierced by a single-leaf wood-frame glass door with a one-light side light and a rectangular wood transom. The opening, which is accessed via brick steps with brick wing walls, is highlighted by a splayed concrete lintel with a keystone. A one-light vinyl casement window with a concrete sill and splayed concrete lintel is located south of the entryway. The northernmost bays on the second and third stories hold single-leaf paneled wood doors with splayed concrete lintels with keystones. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills and splayed concrete lintels with keystones. A three-story, one-bay porch is located in the northern bay on the façade. The first story is supported by a solid brick foundation which is pierced on the southern elevation by a single-leaf door. Brick piers support a wood porch on the second story. This porch has square wood balusters and a flat roof supported by wood Tuscan columns. The third story porch also has square wood balusters.

The south (side) elevation was not fully visible from the public right-of-way, but openings hold 1/1, double-hung, vinylsash windows with concrete sills and three-course rowlock brick segmental arches. Metal fire escapes are attached to this elevation. The north (side) elevation is fenestrated with three 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with rowlock brick sills and three-course rowlock brick segmental arches; other openings have been infilled.

The rear (east) elevation was obscured by rear fencing and garages, but a four-story metal porch spans the elevation. This porch was accessed on the second, third, and fourth stories by sliding metal-frame glass doors with one-light transoms. A single-leaf paneled wood door with a one-light transom highlighted by a three-course rowlock brick segmental arch and a window opening with a three-course rowlock brick segmental arch are located in the northernmost bay on the first story.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This apartment building is located on the east side of 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the concrete sidewalk. The south (side) elevation is adjacent to an alleyway and the north (side) elevation is adjacent to an asphalt-paved parking area. The sunken front yard contains immature shrubs and is bounded by a brick retaining wall. Brick walkways lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary and basement entrances. A concrete walkway leads from the primary brick walkway and travels to the side yard enclosed by wood privacy fencing where a parking area is located. A small yard enclosed by a brick wall and a former garage, now dwellings, are located at the rear of the dwelling.

It is one of five rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#2487). The six-course American-bond brick and stone structure sits on a solid concrete and brick foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is complemented by a false mansard of slate fish scale shingles set between two brick firewalls on the façade (west elevation). The mansard features a molded metal cornice with modillions and dentils. An interior-side brick chimney pierces the roof on the south elevation. The façade is faced with stretcher-bond brick. A two-story brick ell is located on the north bay of the rear elevation and is original. The ell is capped by a sloped roof and was partially obscured by rear fencing. The first story holds a large multi-light wood or vinyl window and the second story is pierced by two-leaf wood French doors.

The rear (east) elevation is fenestrated with 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches. A two-story, two-bay brick ell is located on the south bay of the rear elevation and is original. The ell is capped by a sloped roof. The southern bay on the first story holds a single-leaf door. All other openings hold 1/1, double-hung, wood- or vinyl-sash windows with rowlock brick or concrete sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches. A one-story, two-bay wood porch is located on the ell and sits on wood pier foundation. Wood posts support the shed roof of asphalt shingles. Square wood balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via wood steps.

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-and-a-half-story, three-bay Classical Revival-style rowhouse was constructed in 1909 by M.L. Gottwals from the design of Edward O. Volland. It is one of five similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#2487). The brick and stone structure sits on a solid concrete and brick foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is fronted by a false mansard of slate fish scale shingles between two brick firewalls on the façade (west elevation). The mansard is pierced by hipped dormers with slate shingles that hold twelve-light fixed wood windows. A molded metal cornice with modillions and dentils completes the roof. The façade is faced with stretcher-bond brick. The foundation is pierced by a window opening with a concrete-lug lintel in the southern end bay. The northernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf wood door with a one-light wood transom and a concrete-lug lintel. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills. Openings on the first story have concrete-lug lintels while openings on the second story have splayed brick lintels with concrete keystones. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a brick pier foundation with decorative concrete block infill. The porch has a sloped roof with overhanging eaves and a molded cornice and is supported by square brick posts. Metal balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the northern end bay.

The rear (east) elevation is fenestrated with a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window on the first story and a 4/4, doublehung, wood-sash window with a concrete sill on the second story. Both openings have two-course rowlock brick segmental arches. A two-story, two-bay brick ell is located on the north bay of the rear elevation and is original. An exterior brick chimney with a corbeled cap is located in the southeast corner of the ell, which is capped by a sloped roof. A two-story porch with a shed roof has been enclosed by vinyl siding. The first story holds a single-leaf door in the northern end bay and 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows and one-light fixed vinyl windows in other openings. The second story holds 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with false 6/6 muntins.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the east side of 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the concrete sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 635 and 639 5th Street, N.E. The flat, raised front yard contains mature trees and shrubs and is bounded by a stone retaining wall and bow and picket metal fence. Concrete steps lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary entrance. A yard bordered by wood privacy fencing and an asphalt-paved parking area are located at the rear of the dwelling.

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-story, two-bay Queen Anne-style rowhouse displays Italianate influences and is set on a solid brick foundation. The dwelling was constructed by C.M. McClay in 1892 and is one of four rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#2815). The brick dwelling is faced with pressed stretcher-bond brick on the façade (east elevation) and is capped by a sloped roof. A molded metal and corbeled brick cornice complement the roof. A concrete water table is located above the raised foundation. The foundation is pierced by a single-leaf paneled door with lights and a one-light transom in the southernmost bay. The southernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf metal storm door highlighted by a one-light transom and a rusticated concrete-lug lintel. This door leads to an inner vestibule with a two-leaf paneled wood door. The entry is accessed via metal steps with gas pipe railings. The second story opening holds a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window with a concrete slill and a rusticated concrete-lug lintel. A three-sided rectangular bay with rounded corners projects from the northernmost bay of the façade and rises the full height of the dwelling. The bay shares the material treatment of the main block and is capped by a pyramidal roof of slate shingles with a metal finial. The foundation level is pierced by 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window openings. All openings on the bay hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window openings. The north (side) elevation shares the material treatment of the façade. The projecting bay from the façade continues around the corner onto the side elevation. The main block has decorative recessed brick panels and concrete sill courses below window openings. A three-sided rectangular bay projects from the western end bay of the elevation and rises two stories. The foundation is pierced by 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows, and the remainder of the bay is fenestrated with 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with soldier brick segmental arches capped by header brick molding. The rear (west) elevation was partially obscured by rear fencing. An interior brick chimney with a parged cap is located on this elevation, which is fenestrated with 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with header brick sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches on the second story.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This end-unit rowhouse is located on a corner lot on the west side of 6th Street, N.E. at the intersection of 6th Street and G Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the brick sidewalk. The south (side) elevation is adjacent to 652 6th Street, N.E. A flat front and side yard is dotted with plants and immature shrubs and is bounded by a metal bow and picket fence. A brick walkway leads from the sidewalk and travels toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard enclosed by wood privacy fencing is located at the rear of the dwelling.

A two-story, two-bay appendage is located on the rear of the ell; this appendage is present on the 1928 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map. The appendage is set on a concrete pier foundation and is clad with aluminum siding. The addition is capped by a shed roof and is fenestrated with 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows. A single-leaf paneled wood door with diamond lights is located in the southern end bay of the first story and is accessible via steps.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the east side of 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the concrete sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 611 and 615 5th Street, N.E. The flat, raised front yard contains mature shrubs and foundation plantings. The yard is bounded by a stone retaining wall and a milled point metal fence. Concrete steps lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary entrance. A yard bordered by chain link metal fencing is located at the rear of the dwelling.

March 2010: This two-and-a-half-story, three-bay Colonial Revival-style rowhouse was constructed by J.W. Powell in 1912. It is one of three similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#4713). The brick structure sits on a solid concrete foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is fronted by a false mansard of asphalt shingles between two brick firewalls on the façade (east elevation). The mansard is pierced by a gabled dormer with molded wood cornice and raking that holds twelve-light fixed wood windows. A molded and boxed metal cornice with scroll modillions completes the roof. The façade is faced with Flemish-bond pressed brick. The foundation is pierced by a single-leaf paneled door in the southernmost bay and a two-light vinyl sliding window with a concrete sill and concrete-lug lintel in the northernmost bay. The southernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf flush wood door with one light and a one-light wood transom with a concrete-lug lintel. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills and concrete-lug lintels. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a brick pier foundation. The porch has a half-hipped roof with overhanging eaves and is supported by wood Tuscan columns atop brick posts. Wood balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the northern end bay.

A two-story, two-bay ell constructed of five-course American-bond brick is located on the southern end of the rear (west) elevation and is original. Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-and-a-half-story, three-bay Colonial Revival-style rowhouse was constructed by J.W. Powell in 1912. It is one of three similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#4713). The brick structure sits on a solid concrete foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is fronted by a false mansard of slate fish scale shingles between two brick firewalls on the façade (east elevation). The mansard is pierced by two gabled dormers with molded wood cornices and raking that hold twelve-light fixed wood windows. A molded and boxed metal cornice with scroll modillions completes the roof. The façade is faced with Flemish-bond pressed brick. Turned concrete balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the northern end bay.

A two-story, two-bay ell constructed of five-course American-bond brick is located on the northern end of the rear (west) elevation and is original. The ell is capped by a sloping roof and an exterior brick chimney with a parged cap is located at the southwest corner. Openings in the northernmost bay on the first and second stories of the west elevation hold single-leaf doors highlighted by single-light transoms. The southernmost bays on both stories hold 1/1, double-hung, sash windows (materials not visible). A two-story mesh-enclosed wood-frame porch spans the elevation. The porch has a shed roof supported by wood posts. Solid wood balustrades encircle the porch, which is accessed on the first story via a single-leaf wood-frame mesh door.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the west side of 6th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 626 and 638 6th Street, N.E. The flat front yard is planted with immature shrubs and trees and is bounded by a concrete retaining wall and metal bow and picket fencing. Concrete steps and a concrete walkway lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard enclosed by wood privacy fencing and a garage are located at the rear of the dwelling.

Classical Revival

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-story, three-bay Classical Revival-style rowhouse was constructed by A.M. Schneider in 1907. It is one of eight similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#3857). The seven-course American-bond brick and stone structure sits on a solid concrete and brick foundation. The dwelling is capped by a false mansard roof of asphalt shingles with overhanging eaves that is complemented by a molded metal cornice and block modillions. The façade (east elevation) is faced with Flemish-bond brick. A four-course molded brick watertable is located above the foundation, which is pierced by a single-leaf, wood-frame glass door in the southern end bay. The first story holds a single-leaf wood-frame glass door with a one-light transom and a three-course rowlock brick segmental arch in the northernmost bay. This entryway is accessed via metal steps with hand rails. The remainder of the façade is fenestrated with 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills and splayed brick and concrete arches.

The south (side) elevation received the same material treatment and fenestration as the façade. An exterior-side brick chimney with corbeled cap is located on this elevation. The foundation is pierced by single-light windows (materials not visible). A three-sided, canted bay projects from the western end bay of the elevation and rises two stories. It is capped by a shed roof. Concrete lug lintel courses span the bay above the 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows on the first and second stories.

A brick parapet wall with metal coping rises from the southern bay of the rear (west) elevation and does not extend the whole width of the elevation. A two-leaf, wood-frame glass door with a one-light rectangular transom is located on the first story of the southernmost bay. This opening is highlighted by a two-course rowlock brick segmental arch. A two-leaf opening in the northern end bay has been partially infilled and now holds a single-leaf wood-frame glass door with a rectangular one-light transom and a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window with a concrete sill. Both openings are highlighted by a two-course rowlock brick segmental arch. This entry is accessed via metal steps with metal hand rails. A central bay on the second story holds a single-leaf wood-frame glass door with a one-light transom and is highlighted by a two-course rowlock brick segmental arch. The second story is further fenestrated by 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arch. The second story is further fenestrated by 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arch. A segmental arches. An exterior brick chimney is located on the northernmost bay of this elevation and has a corbeled cap.

March 2010: This end-unit rowhouse is located on the west side of 6th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the brick sidewalk. The north elevation is adjacent to 610 6th Street and the south elevation is adjacent to a brick alley. The flat, grassy front yard is planted with mature shrubs and is bordered by a metal milled point fence. A concrete walkway leads from the sidewalk and travels toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard, enclosed by a wood privacy fence, is located at the rear of the dwelling.

The northernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with lights and a blind wood transom. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete-lug sills and brick and concrete splayed arches. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a brick pier foundation. The porch has a half-hipped roof with overhanging eaves and is supported by metal filigree posts atop brick posts. Metal balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the northern end bay.

The original two-story, two-bay porch with a shed roof on the rear (west) elevation of the dwelling has been enclosed and is clad in aluminum siding. An interior brick chimney with a plain cap is located on the northernmost bay of this elevation. The elevation is fenestrated with 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows. A one-story enclosed porch with a flat roof extends from the southern end bay of the first story. The wood-frame structure is infilled with mesh and a singleleaf, paneled wood door pierces the northernmost bay of the west elevation. This door is accessed via wooden steps with wooden hand rails.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the west side of 6th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 618 and 622 6th Street, N.E. The flat, raised front yard is landscaped with immature shrubs and is bounded by a stone retaining wall and milled point metal fencing. Concrete steps and concrete walkways lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard and an asphalt-paved parking area are located at the rear of the dwelling.

Classical Revival

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-story, three-bay Classical Revival-style rowhouse was constructed by A.M. Schneider in 1907. It is one of eight similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#3857). The seven-course American-bond brick and stone structure sits on a solid concrete and brick foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is fronted by a false mansard of asphalt shingles on the façade. The mansard is complemented by a gabled pediment and molded metal cornice with block modillions. The façade (east elevation) is faced with Flemish-bond brick. A four-course molded brick watertable is located above the foundation, which is pierced by a single-leaf flush wood door in the southern end bay. The northernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with lights and a one-light wood transom. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete-lug sills and brick and concrete splayed arches. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a foundation of concrete block piers that have been infilled with decorative concrete blocks. The porch has a half-hipped roof with overhanging eaves and is supported by metal filigree posts. Metal balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the northern end bay.

A two-story addition spans the width of the rear (west) elevation. This contemporary addition (ca. 2000) is constructed of concrete and is faced with horizontal siding. The first story is pierced by a large opening that holds metal-frame casement, fixed, and sliding windows and a single-leaf metal-frame glass door in the southern end bay. A single-light metal casement window is also located in the northern bay. The second story is fenestrated by a band of metal windows (and/or doors) that lead out onto a metal balcony with metal balusters.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the west side of 6th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 620 and 624 6th Street, N.E. The flat, raised front yard is bounded by a stone retaining wall and metal chain link fencing. Concrete steps and a concrete walkway lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard enclosed by wood privacy and metal chain link fencing are located at the rear of the dwelling.

Colonial Revival

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-story, three-bay Colonial Revival-style rowhouse was constructed by J.W. Powell in 1912. It is one of three similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#4107). The brick structure sits on a solid concrete foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is fronted by a false mansard of slate fish scale shingles between two brick firewalls on the façade (east elevation). The mansard is pierced by two gabled dormers with molded wood cornices and raking that hold twelve-light fixed wood windows. A molded and boxed metal cornice with scroll modillions completes the roof. The façade is faced with Flemish-bond pressed brick. The foundation is pierced by a one-light wood window in the northern end bay. The southernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with a one-light transom and a concrete-lug lintel. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete-lug sills and lintels. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a brick pier foundation. The half-hipped roof features overhanging eaves with a molded wood cornice. The roof is supported by metal filigree posts set atop brick posts. Metal balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the southern end bay. Beneath the porch, the foundation of the main block is pierced by a single-leaf paneled wood door with lights.

A two-story, two-bay ell constructed of six-course American-bond brick is located on the southern end of the rear (west) elevation and is original. The ell is capped by a sloping roof and an exterior brick chimney with a parged cap is located at the northwest corner. The main block is fenestrated with 1/1, double-hung, wood-sash windows in segmental openings on the first and second stories. The foundation is also pierced by a window set in a segmental opening. On the west elevation of the ell, openings in the southernmost bay on the first and second stories hold single-leaf doors highlighted by single-light transoms. The northernmost bays on both stories hold 1/1, double-hung, wood-sash windows with concrete sills in segmental openings. A two-story, one-bay wood porch spans the elevation. The porch has a shed roof supported by wood posts. Wood balusters encircle the porch on the second story, which is accessed on the first story via wood steps in the southern end bay.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the west side of 6th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 642 and 646 6th Street, N.E. There is a flat, grassy front yard. Concrete steps and a concrete walkway lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard enclosed by wood privacy fencing is located at the rear of the dwelling.

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-story, two-bay Classical Revival-style rowhouse was constructed by L.E. Breuninger from the design of N.R. Grimm in 1910. It is one of three similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#4187). The six-course American-bond brick structure sits on a solid concrete foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is complemented by a molded and boxed metal cornice with egg and dart molding on the façade (west elevation), which is faced with stretcher-bond pressed brick. The northernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with a one-light wood transom and a splayed concrete lintel with keystone. The entry is accessed via concrete steps with brick wing walls. A three-sided canted bay rises the full height of the dwelling and projects from the southern end bay. The bay shares the material treatment of the main block. The foundation is pierced by one-light fixed stained glass windows with splayed brick arches. All other openings on the façade hold 2/2, double-hung, wood-sash windows with concrete sills and splayed concrete lintels with keystones.

A two-story, two-bay brick ell projects from the southernmost bay of the rear elevation and is original to the dwelling. The ell was partially obscured by rear fencing. A single-leaf door with a one-light transom is located in the southern end bay on the first story. This opening features a three-course rowlock brick segmental arch. The second story in the southern bay holds a single-leaf wood French door with a one-light transom and the northern bay holds a 2/2, double-hung, wood-sash window; both openings are highlighted by concrete sills and three-course rowlock brick segmental arch.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the east side of 5th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the concrete sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 615 and 619 5th Street, N.E. The flat, raised front yard contains mature shrubs and trees and is bounded by a stone retaining wall. Concrete steps lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary entrance. A yard and a garage are located at the rear of the dwelling.

The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is fronted by a false mansard of slate fish scale shingles between two brick firewalls on the façade (east elevation). A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a solid brick foundation. The balt-hipped roof of the porch features overhanging eaves and is supported by wood Tuscan columns. Square wood balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the western end bay.

March 2010: This two-story, three-bay Classical Revival-style rowhouse was constructed by A.M. Schneider in 1907. It is one of five similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#3858). The brick and stone structure sits on a solid concrete and brick foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is fronted by a false mansard of asphalt shingles on the façade. The mansard is complemented by a gabled pediment and a molded metal cornice with block modillions. The façade (south elevation) is faced with Flemish-bond brick. A four-course molded brick watertable is located above the foundation, which is pierced by a single-leaf, paneled wood door with lights in the eastern end bay. The foundation is pierced on the south elevation by a one-light vinyl awning window and on the east elevation by a single-leaf wood door. The half-hipped roof of the porch features overhanging eaves and is supported by square wood posts. Square wood balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via wood steps in the western end bay.

The rear (north) elevation was partially obscured by rear fencing. An exterior-end chimney with a parged cap is located in the westernmost bay. A single-leaf wood-frame glass door with a two-light transom is located in the western bay of the first story. This door is set in a two-course rowlock brick segmental arch shared with a 1/1, double-hung, wood-sash window. This entry is accessed via steps with metal hand rails. The elevation is further fenestrated by single and paired 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the north side of F Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 518 and 522 F Street, N.E. The flat front yard contains immature shrubs and is bounded by a brick retaining wall and milled point metal fence. Concrete steps and a concrete walkway lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary and basement entrances. The façade is faced with Flemish-bond pressed brick. The foundation is pierced by a one-light vinyl awning window in the northern end bay. The southernmost bay of the first story holds a replacement single-leaf paneled door with lights with a one-light transom and a concrete-lug lintel. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete-lug sills and lintels. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade roof is supported by metal Tuscan columns set atop brick posts. Turned metal balusters span the porch on the sides, while the east elevation holds a decorative concrete block balustrade. The porch is accessed via concrete steps in the southern end bay. Beneath the porch, the foundation of the main block is pierced by a single-leaf paneled metal door with a semicircular light.

The rear (west) elevation is fenestrated with 1/1, double-hung, wood- and vinyl-sash windows in segmental openings on the first and second stories. A two-story, two-bay ell constructed of irregularly coursed American-bond brick is located on the southern end of the elevation and is original. The ell is capped by a sloping roof and an exterior brick chimney with a parged cap is located at the northwest corner. On the west elevation of the ell, openings in the southernmost bay on the first and second stories hold single-leaf doors highlighted by single-light transoms. The northernmost bays on both stories hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with concrete sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches. A two-story, one-bay wood porch spans the elevation and is supported by wood posts. Wood balusters encircle the porch on both stories, which is accessed on the first story via wood steps in the southern end bay.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the west side of 6th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 646 and 650 6th Street, N.E. There is a flat front yard with minimal grass and plantings. A brick walkway leads from the sidewalk and travels toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard enclosed by wood privacy fencing is located at the rear of the dwelling.

The brick and stone structure sits on a solid concrete and brick foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is fronted by a false mansard of asphalt shingles on the façade. The mansard is complemented by a gabled pediment and a molded metal cornice with block modillions. The façade (south elevation) is faced with Flemish-bond brick. A four-course molded brick watertable is located above the foundation, which is pierced by a single-leaf, paneled wood door with lights in the eastern end bay. The westernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with lights and a one-light wood transom. All other openings on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows with false 6/1 muntins. The windows feature concrete sills and brick and concrete splayed arches. A one-story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a foundation of brick piers infilled with wood lattice. The half-hipped roof of the porch features overhanging eaves and is supported by wood Tuscan columns. Square wood balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the western end bay.

The rear (north) elevation is fenestrated by single and paired 1/1, double-hung, vinyl- and wood-sash windows with concrete-lug sills and two-course rowlock brick segmental arches. An exterior-end chimney with a corbeled cap is located in the westernmost bay. The western bay of the elevation holds a two-story, one-bay wood deck supported by wood posts. The deck is encircled by square wood balusters and is accessed on the first story by a single-leaf wood-frame glass door. This door is set in a two-course rowlock brick segmental arch with a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window. The second story holds a single-leaf, wood-frame glass door with a one-light transom. Wood steps with hand rails also access the first story of the deck.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the north side of F Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 514 and 518 F Street, N.E. The flat, grassy front yard contains mature trees and shrubs and is bounded by a stone retaining wall and bow and picket metal fence. Concrete steps and a concrete walkway lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard, enclosed by a wood privacy fence, is located at the rear of the dwelling.

Exterior & Architectural Notes:

March 2010: This two-and-a-half-story, three-bay Colonial Revival-style rowhouse was constructed by J.W. Powell in 1912. It is one of three similar rowhouses constructed from the same permit (#4713). The brick structure sits on a solid concrete foundation. The dwelling is capped by a sloping roof that is fronted by a false mansard of slate fish scale shingles between two brick firewalls on the façade (east elevation). The mansard is pierced by two gabled dormers with molded wood cornices and raking that hold twelve-light fixed wood windows. A molded and boxed metal cornice with scroll modillions completes the roof. The façade is faced with Flemish-bond pressed brick. The foundation is pierced by a 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window with false 6/1 muntins and a concrete-lug lintel in the southern end bay. The northernmost bay of the first story holds a single-leaf paneled wood door with a one-light wood transom and a concrete-lug lintel. All other opening in the southernmost bay on the façade hold 1/1, double-hung, vinyl-sash window so the façade and is set on a solid brick foundation. The foundation is pierced by a solid protect story, one-bay porch projects from the façade and is set on a solid brick foundation. The foundation is pierced by a single-leaf metal-frame glass door. The porch has a half-hipped roof with overhanging eaves and is supported by wood Tuscan columns atop brick posts. A self-supporting metal awning is located on the east elevation of the porch and shelters the basement entry. Wood balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed via concrete steps in the northern end bay.

A two-story, two-bay ell constructed of five-course American-bond brick is located on the northern end of the rear (west) elevation and is original. The ell is capped by a sloping roof and an exterior brick chimney with a parged cap is located at the southwest corner. Openings in the northernmost bay on the first and second stories of the west elevation hold single-leaf paneled wood doors with lights. These openings are highlighted by single-light transoms and brick segmental arches. The southernmost bays on both stories hold 1/1, double-hung, sash windows (materials not visible) with concrete sills and brick segmental arches. A two-story, one-bay porch spans the elevation and is supported by square wood piers and is infilled with wood lattice on the first story. The porch has a shed roof supported by wood posts. Wood balusters encircle the porch, which is accessed on the first story via wood steps in the northern end bay.

Site Notes:

March 2010: This rowhouse is located on the west side of 6th Street, N.E. and is set back approximately ten feet from the brick sidewalk. The dwelling is adjacent to 622 and 626 6th Street, N.E. The flat, raised front yard is planted with mature shrubs and is bounded by a brick retaining wall and metal bow and hairpin fencing. Concrete steps and a concrete walkway lead from the sidewalk and travel toward the primary and basement entrances. A yard enclosed by metal chain link fencing and a garage are located at the rear of the dwelling.
