RFK Stadium: From the Past to the Future

The Capitol Hill Restoration Society has announced the winner of the 2020 Dick Wolf Prize – Nicholas Malin, a graduate of Georgetown University Law Center and an attorney for the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development.

On March 27 at 7 p.m., Nick will discuss the historic context of sports stadiums, with emphasis on the unique history of RFK, and how that might inform us about the future of RFK Stadium in terms of its eligibility for historic preservation and future uses. A reception will follow.
