... **Preservation Café: Restoring Windows**. Neil Mozer, owner of Mozer Works, Inc., will share his passion and expertise for old windows on Wednesday, November 14 in the downstairs meeting room at Northeast Neighborhood Library, 330 7th St. NE. Mozer, who has been a carpenter/builder for more than 25 years, will explain why old windows are important and just what it takes to do a professional restoration. "A restored 100-year-old window will last another 100 years, so it's worth the investment," according to Mozer. Also, restored old windows preserve the architectural character of the building.
