...**Preservation Café: "Restoration Tools and Materials of DC's Historic Masonry Building."** Gary Barnhart will explain what to consider when repairing/maintaining the masonry of your home, Wednesday, November 20 at 6:30 p.m. at East City Bookshop, 645 Pennsylvania Ave. SE.

Washington DC has one of the highest concentrations of historic brick buildings in the United States, yet only a small portion of local masonry workers are familiar with historic restoration. Correct methods for masonry preservation vary depending on the type of building material used (stone, brick, cement, etc.). There are historic tools that are reproduced and used in modern times and tools, invented only recently, that may speed things up but also can cause damage if used improperly.

Proactive and preventative maintenance can save money and ensure a positive return on your investment. Free. All are welcome.
